INDEPENDENT ACCOUNTANT'S REPORT ON APPLYING AGREED-UPON PROCEDURES

We have performed the procedures enumerated in Attachment II, which were agreed to by Foothill-De Anza Community College District (the "District") and the Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee for Measure C (the "Committee"), solely to assist the Committee in evaluating District management's assertions concerning activity related to bond funds through June 30, 2007 as detailed in Attachments IV and V. This agreed-upon procedures engagement was performed in accordance with attestation standards established by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants. The sufficiency of these procedures is solely the responsibility of the District and the Committee. Consequently, we make no representation regarding the sufficiency of the procedures described in Attachment II either for the purpose for which this report has been requested or for any other purpose.

The procedures performed and conclusions reached as a result of these procedures are identified in Attachment II. Attachments I and III provide background information on the Measure C General Obligation Bond issuance.

We were not engaged to, and did not, perform an examination, the objective of which would be the expression of an opinion on management's assertions. Accordingly, we do not express such an opinion. Had we performed other procedures, other matters might have come to our attention that would have been reported to you.

This report is intended solely for the use of Foothill-De Anza Community College District and the Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee for Measure C and should not be used by those who have not agreed to the procedures and taken responsibility for the sufficiency of the procedures for their purposes.

FOOTHILL-DE ANZA COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT BACKGROUND INFORMATION

LEGISLATIVE HISTORY

On November 7, 2000, California voters approved Proposition 39, the Smaller Classes, Safer Schools, and Financial Accountability Act. Proposition 39 amended portions of the California Constitution to provide for the issuance of general obligation bonds by school districts, community college districts, or county offices of education, "for the construction, reconstruction, rehabilitation, or replacement of school facilities, including the furnishing and equipping of school facilities, or the acquisition or lease of real property for school facilities", upon approval by 55% of the electorate.

FOOTHILL-DE ANZA COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT MEASURE C GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS

On June 6, 2006, the electorate of the Foothill-De Anza Community College District approved the \$490.8 million Measure C General Obligation Bonds with 65.69% of the votes in favor. The purpose of the bonds is as follows:

To upgrade electrical, heating, ventilation systems, fire/seismic safety; repair leaky roofs; improve disabled access; repair/expand classrooms for nurses/paramedics; upgrade technology; repair, construct, acquire, equip buildings, classrooms, libraries, sites, and science/computer labs.

FOOTHILL-DE ANZA COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT PROCEDURES PERFORMED AND CONCLUSIONS

PROCEDURES PERFORMED

Foothill-De Anza Community College District provided a list of all Measure C project expenditures (the "List"). An approximate total of 550 warrants were identified representing \$4,687,541 in expenditures from July 1, 2006 to June 30, 2007. We performed the following procedures to the List of Measure C bond expenditures:

- Verified the mathematical accuracy of the List.
- Selected a sample of 50 expenditures totaling \$2,440,371. The sample was selected to provide a representation across specific construction projects, vendors, and expenditure amounts. The sample represented 9% of the total number of expenditures and 52% of the total expenditure value.
- Examined purchase orders and invoices for each of the expenditures.
- Verified that the expenditures were made for the acquisition, construction, renovation, repair and modernization of District property and facilities and that funds were not spent for salaries or other administrative expenses.

CONCLUSIONS

- The List was mathematically accurate.
- 50 expenditures tested represented valid Bond expenditures, were properly coded, were determined to represent acquisition, construction, renovation, repair and modernization of District property and facilities and were not spent for salaries or other administrative expenses.
- Four expenditures did not receive all required approval signatures prior to disbursement. These expenditures were for valid bond purposes.

 - Repair, build, upgrade and/or replace leaky roofs, decaying walls, old ceiling tiles and flooring, plumbing, sewer and drainage systems, inefficient electrical systems and wiring, deteriorated restrooms, heating, ventilation and cooling systems, foundations, telecommunications systems, classrooms, lecture halls, language labs, fields, courts and grounds, science and other instructional laboratories and healthcare workforce facilities, technology center, theatre, library, administrative facilities, public safety, records and counseling buildings and other instructional facilities,
 - Wire classrooms for computers and other technology,
 - Increase energy efficiency,
 - Acquire equipment,
 - Increase safety, reduce fire hazards with alarms, smoke detectors, fire safety doors and sprinklers.
 - Reduce operating costs in order for more classes and job training to be offered,
 - Improve academic instruction,
 - Meet legal requirements for disabled access.

Upgrade Technology:

- Provide state-of-the-art technology facilities,
- Upgrade Internet access and wireless and cable technology.
- Build "smart classrooms" to improve technology-enhanced learning,
- Upgrade telecommunications systems,
- Upgrade campus-wide technology, including a new Educational Information System,
- Replace outdated computers,
- Replace network infrastructure equipment,
- Install wiring upgrades.
- Repair, Replace and Upgrade Electrical and Mechanical Systems to Reduce Energy Consumption and Utility Bills and Accommodate Computer Technology, Internet Access and Communications Systems, Install Solar Panels to Reduce Energy Consumption and Utility Bills.

 - Enhance erosion controls,
 - Repair uneven sidewalks and walkways,
 - Improve accessibility for the disabled.
- Expand Classroom and Facility Capacity, Construct Science Center, Upgrade Classrooms/Labs For Nursing and Emergency Medical Services:
 - Increase permanent classroom and facility capacity for academic and job training classes, including math and health care programs,
 - Upgrade science labs, physical and health education, and applied arts and sciences facilities.
 - Upgrade campus technology,

- Build data center to support new District-wide computer and technology systems and integrate with renovated central office facility.
